- Never throw until all people in your line of fire have cleared away.
- 5. A throw that lands out of bounds is to be carried in and played from the point where the disc went out of bounds, with a one stroke penalty.
  - directly below the hanging location. No penalty applies.
  - A disc that comes to rest above the ground is played from a spot
- A disc that comes to rest inside the basket or chains constitutes
  successful completion of that hole. A disc that comes to rest on top of
  the basket does not constitute a successful putt.
  - a player may not step past the line after throwing.
- 5. A run-up and normal follow thru after release are allowed when throwing more than 30 feet from the basket. When closer than 30 feet,
  - 12 inches behind the spot where the last throw came to rest.
- $4. \hspace{0.5cm}$  Fairway throws must be made with the foot closet to the basket within
  - always throws first.
  - 3. After teeing off, the player whose disc is farthest from the basket
    - hole is the first to tee off.
- 2. Tee throws must be completed from behind the Tee bar and within the designated tee area. The player with the fewest strokes on the previous
  - object is to get the lowest score.
- Disc golf is played using flying discs instead of a ball. One stroke is counted each time the disc is thrown, or when a penalty is incurred. The

While these are not the official rules, they are appropriate for beginners. Tournament rules are much more detailed and specific.

## BUCKNELL UNIVERSITY DISC GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

- 1. Do not throw your disc if it could possibly hit someone.
- 2. If someone is in the way, politely ask them to move.
- If your disc looks like it may come close to someone, immediately yell "FORE."
- 4. If the group behind you is playing faster than you, offer to let them play through.
- 5. Do not litter.
- 6. Throw discs only at the baskets.
- 7. Stay on the ground and out of the trees and off of the baskets.
- 8. Be respectful to those around you.
- 9. Do not hit lamp posts.
- 10. The course is open only during daylight hours.
